1. BACKGROUND

BANKSETA is a statutory body established through the Skills Development Act of 1998 to enable its stakeholders to advance the national and global position of the banking and microfinance industry. As guided by its mandate the BANKSETA is an agent of transformation and will promote employment equity and Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment through skills development.

2. BACKGROUND TO ASSIGNMENT

The BANKSETA is licensed under Microsoft 365 E5, which includes collaboration tools such as SharePoint Online, Power Apps, and Power Automate. The organization has developed and implemented a cloud-based SharePoint site known as "PeopleHub", hosted securely within the Microsoft environment. The platform currently supports seventeen (17) business units with approximately 126 users at full capacity. The BANKSETA aims to enhance the SharePoint environment:

- enable secure sharing of information/records/documents among staff and key stakeholders such as the Office of the Auditor-General and the appointed service providers.
- 2. Enable Integration with existing systems that including "SigningHub" and the Helpdesk system (developed in power apps).

To support these objectives, BANKSETA seeks to appoint a qualified and experienced service provider to provide support, maintenance, and enhancement of the existing SharePoint platform.

3. SCOPE OF WORK

The service provider will be expected to:

- 3.1. The service provider is expected to provide the following services for a period of 24 months:
- 3.1.1. Remote and on-site support (as may be required) for SharePoint issues.
 - a. Assist the BANKSETA with user and permission management.

- b. Attend to incidents on SharePoint.
- 3.1.2. Maintenance and health checks on SharePoint portal and SharePoint Admin Centre on M365 E5 monthly for 24 months.
- 3.1.3. Development and implementation of SharePoint adoption program (user awareness session, user training) for BANKSETA.
- 3.1.4. Implementation of any enhancements (customization, development, testing, commissioning) as and when requested
- 3.1.5. Provision of Skills Transfer to ICT personnel.
- 3.2. Provision of monthly reports for 24 months. The monthly report should include but not limited to
 - a. Tasks performed
 - b. Hours utilized
 - c. Outstanding issues, or
 - d. Recommendations

N.B. The number of hours not used shall accumulate from month to month, and year to year without any cost escalations. (*number of hours not used in a certain month shall be accumulated into the following month and so is into the following year*).

4. DURATION OF THE CONTRACT

Two (2) years/24 months.

5. TECHNICAL / FUNCTIONAL EVALUATION

The bidder must comply with the following criteria, to qualify to be evaluated further under cost evaluation (Price plus BANKSETA PPP point system).

CRITERIA

5.1. Track record of the bidder (Company Experience)

5.1.1. The track record of the bidder should be provided through reference letters from clients where the bidder has successfully implemented or is currently implementing / developing / Supporting the Microsoft 365 SharePoint.

Provide three (3) refence letter.

The reference letters should

- a. Be on the client's letterhead,
- b. Be signed and dated
- c. Indicate the work done.
- d. Show the client contact details including contact name and telephone or email address.

5.2. Experience and qualification / Certification of personnel

5.2.1. Experience and qualification of Team Leader.

The service provider should provide a CV of a team leader with

a. a project management certificate (PMBOK, PRINCE2 or NQF qualification) or any other supplementary proof, and - three (3) years' experience in IT Project Management and - any qualification on NQF Level 6 or higher in any field.

The bidder must clearly indicate the name of a person assigned to the role of a team leader and failure to do so will result in disqualification.

5.2.2. Experience and qualification of team member No1.

The service provider should provide a CV for a team member with:

- a. At least three (3) years or more experience in SharePoint Services
- b. qualification which should be at least Grade 12 / Matric or NQF Level 4 in any field or higher
- c. Proof of certificate or certification or any supplementary proof or Microsoft 365 Administrator Expert / Microsoft 365 fundamentals.

The bidder must clearly indicate the name of a person assigned to the role of **team member No1** and failure to do so will result in disqualification.

5.2.3. Experience and qualification of team member No2.

The service provider should provide a CV for a team member with

- a. At least Three (3) years' experience in Power-Apps / Power Automate services/
- b. Proof of certificate or certification or any supplementary proof for SharePoint administration or development Certificate or Power Platform Solution Architect Expert or Power Platform Developer Associate.
- c. qualification at least NQF Level 4 or higher in any field.

The bidder must clearly indicate the name of a person assigned to the role of **team** member 2 and failure to do so will result in disqualification.

NB: The bidder who doesn't comply with the above mandatory requirements will be automatically disqualified.

6. PRICE AND PREFERENCE POINTS

The RFQ will be evaluated using the following:

EXPLANATIONS

- 1.1 Black persons are as defined in Broad based black economic empowerment Act (B-BBEE) which currently means Africans, Coloureds and Indians and Chinese (via a court ruling)
 - (a) who are citizens of the Republic of South Africa by birth or decent; or
 - (b) who became citizens of the Republic of South Africa by naturalisation –
 - (i) before 27 April 1994;
 - (ii) on or after 27 April 1994 and who would have been entitled to acquire citizenship by naturalisation prior to that date.
- 1.2 Black Person Ownership points will be awarded to a Tenderer who have 51% or more black ownership. The shareholding will determine the ownership.
- 1.3 Women ownership points will be awarded to a Tenderer who have 33% or more women ownership who are South African citizens.
- 1.4 Youth ownership points will be awarded to a Tenderer who have 33% or more youth ownership being persons 35 years and below, determined at the date of tender/ RFQ closing. Youth ownership will be determined based on the shareholding of the members who are defined as youth and are South African citizens.

- 1.5 Small and medium business includes all South African businesses, co-operatives and non-governmental organisations with annual turnover up to R10 million or alternatively, these entities are recently incorporated, have been operating for less than one year and are projected to have annual turnover of less than R10 million in the first year. The ownership of small and medium business, co-operatives or non-governmental organisations should be 100% South African citizens (or entities owned 100% by South Africa citizens).
- 1.6 An entity may claim points based on the same shareholding or persons in more than one category. For example black female disabled shareholders under 35 who is a SA citizen may lead a business to claim points under Empowerment of women and youth empowerment

1.7 False Information from Bidders

Should the BANKSETA ascertain that any bidder has submitted any false information, the BANKSETA may disqualify the bidder/service provider, cancel any award without prejudice to any other remedies available to BANKSETA and report the service provider to National Treasury.

The bidder/service provider will be given an opportunity to give reasons why BANKSETA should not take actions detailed above where false information has been submitted.

1.8 The points scored by a bidder in respect of the PREFERENCE POINTS UTILISING BANKSETA GOALS contribution will be added to the points scored for price to arrive at the overall score. Points will be rounded off to the nearest 2 decimals. If two or more tenders have scored equal total points, the contract will be awarded to the bidder scoring the highest number of points for the specified goals or PREFERENCE POINTS UTILISING BANKSETA GOALS contribution.

7. RFQ CONDITIONS

- a. BANKSETA reserves the right to withdraw or amend terms of reference by notice in writing by advertising in the media in which the RFQ was originally advertised prior to the closing date.
- b. BANKSETA reserves the right not to award this RFQ and the right to reduce the quantities awarded.
- c. BANKSETA reserves the right to verify the information submitted and request for further information during evaluation of the proposal.
- d. BANKSETA shall not be liable for any direct, indirect, consequential or other losses or damages including loss of profit that may be incurred by any person including, but not limited to, an Applicant, Short Listed Applicant or Successful

- Applicant, or any director, officer or associated company thereof, as a result of any reliance on or use of information supplied in response to this RFQ or as a result of the RFQ process contemplated in this RFQ document.

8. REVIEW PROCESS

- a) In order to evaluate and adjudicate proposals effectively, it is imperative that applicants submit responsive applications. To ensure an application will be regarded as responsive it is imperative to comply with all conditions pertaining to the application and to complete all the mandatory fields and questionnaires.
- b) All applications duly lodged as per the submission requirements will be evaluated in accordance with the stipulated evaluation criteria.
- c) The validity period of proposals is **90 days** after closing.

9. REASONS FOR REJECTION

- a) Applicants shall not contact BANKSETA on any matter pertaining to the application from the time the application is closed to the time the application has been adjudicated..
- b) BANKSETA shall reject a submission if the applicant has committed a proven corrupt of fraudulent act in competing for a particular contract.

10. FRAUD ALERT

- (a) The BANKSETA does not charge for any documents or information or any matter in regard to any procurement or any BANKSETA work.
- (b) The BANKSETA is aware of fraudsters approaching potential bidders purporting to be able to influence tenders or RFQ for a fee.
